

## FIBER INSTRUMENTS MULTIPLY AT ITC

- ▶ A new Zellweger Uster 900A HVI has been installed at the ITC. It is being used heavily in research, testing and evaluation.
- ► The ITC is serving as a Beta Site for evaluation of a new automatic high-volume instrument manufactured by Premier Polytronics, Ltd. of India.
- ▶ Also from Premier Polytronics, the new FibroSpan 910 has been installed for measuring fiber length and length distribution.
- ► The ITC's Lintronics FCT instrument in now accompanied in the Materials Evaluation Laboratory by Cotton Incorporated's FCT. The purpose is to enable comparative testing and evaluation between the two instruments during the next few months.
